A note to grown-up investors:

Do you ever wish children were more actively involved in spreading God's Word? Parents often hand their children coins for the offering. Children drop them in the plate, globe or little plastic bank with a steeple. But they can do so much more!

Team up with a child to help fund a real-life Bible translation project somewhere around the world. You supply the \$10 investment. The child puts brain and brawn to work, multiplying that money several times over. Both of you give from what you have and God's work moves forward.

Be sure to offer advice and encouragement along the way. Pray for one another and build God's kingdom together!

But I'm Just a Kid!



First of all, you're not *just* a kid! You're a child of God with great potential! Some of you already pray for God's workers, right? Now, your efforts can help finance a real-life Bible translation project. No allowance? No baby-sitting jobs? No problem! Check out this creative idea:

1. Ask your church, school, teacher, relatives or a local business to contribute \$10 to you and other interested kids. You will be partners with these *investors*. Ask for their advice and prayer. Call them often to talk over your plans and progress. (This can be a class, family, club, or church-wide project with parental approval, of course!)
2. Ask God to help you multiply that \$10 in creative ways. He may give you some radical, outrageous, exciting ideas! (Some kids buy flowers and plant them in yards for a fee. Others raise bunnies, hamsters and puppies to sell to their local pet store. Still others buy apples, cans of beverage, brownies, etc. and resell them at school, camp, and base-ball games. Ask God what you should do. He may surprise you!) Look at Proverbs 16:3.
3. After one or two months, go back to the person who invested the \$10. Show them that you have doubled, tripled, or even one hundred times that amount to give to a Bible translation project! Rejoice together and send off your contribution in an envelope. (No cash, please.)
